

Cropping

As a way to explain cropping on your finished images we have included this sheet for your information.

The example below shows three of the most common print size crops. The green line indicates cropping for full frame or more commonly a 4x6 crop. The yellow line represents the cropping for a 5x7 and the red line indicates that of an 8x10. Be advised that the position of the lines on the example below in no way indicates how a final print will be cropped, they are only to show the amount of an image that is lost with each print size.

When taking the photographs we tend to crop our images looser in order to allow for 8x10 cropping of the finished prints. As you look at the initial images from your wedding, please do not be alarmed if there seems to be extra room around the images, that

is there for a reason. The reason being that it will allow us to crop the images later and make them look their best. Below are examples of how the image above would look cropped and printed.

The images were cropped tighter and centered on the main subjects in the images. Be advised that every image will crop differently according to the prints that are ordered from it.
